Congleton & Vale Royal Police division along with the Vale Royal Crime Prevention Panel are extremely concerned with the amount of distraction burglaries that are occurring. Please be aware that bogus officials do operate in this area. If you have a door chain, ensure you use it every time you open the door. Always ask for I.D. and if not satisfied with that shut the door and ask them to wait outside while you phone the company they are supposed to be from (do not use any number they give you). If you are still not satisfied dial 999 immediately. Leaflets are available from Northwich Police Station regarding bogus callers, please dial 01606 48000 and ask for Homewatch for a supply of leaflets. Bogus officials tend to prey mainly on the elderly and vulnerable, so please pass the message on to as many people as possible.

Summer Pudding

Now is the time for the summer fruits, red and black currants, strawberries, raspberries, gooseberries etc., that's if the black birds and slugs haven't eaten them all.

A delicious and simple desert is Summer Pudding, which also freezes well.

2lb mixed soft summer fruits

4ozs caster sugar

4 fl oz milk

8 slices stale white bread (fresh seems OK) crusts removed

- Mix together the fruit and sugar.
- Sprinkle the milk over the bread slices to moisten them.
- Line a greased pudding basin or mould with two-thirds of the bread slices, overlapping them.
- Pour the fruit into the basin and arrange the remaining bread slices on top to cover completely.
- Cover with a piece of foil and put a weight on top.
- Chill for at least 8 hours.
- Turn out to serve.

Chairman's Report to the 1999 Annual Parish Meeting
Held on Thursday 20th May @ Bartington Chapel

Since the last annual parish meeting the council have met on 8 occasions, with an average attendance of 8 councillors. Notices of meetings are displayed on our notice board, which is situated opposite the Talbot Arms. The parish council is here to help with any matters concerning the village so please do not hesitate to contact any of its members.

Some of the issues that have been dealt with during the past year are:-

- Road repairs - A533
- Parking restrictions on lodge lane
- concealed entrance sign - Bartington Chapel
- Corner at Westbrook farm - Higher Lane

Copies of all planning applications made with the village are sent to the council for their comments. This year has been no exception and have included;

- Conservatory @ Chapel Lane, Bartington
- Dwellings at Land adjacent Bartington Hall, Bartington
- New vehicular access - Higher lane Dutton
- Permanent access drive - Hill Top Road, Dutton

Vale Royal Tree planting scheme - This is a yearly scheme of which any one can take part, the only stipulation being that the trees planted have to be in public view. If you have any sites within the village where you would like to see trees planted, please put them forward for consideration.

The last 12 months has seen some changes in the ward boundaries and you may have noted from the recent election that the ward name is now Milton Weaver.

With the Millennium fast approaching any ideas that you may have for the village would be appreciated. Let us know as time is running short.

The council have this year become involved with "Information sharing meetings" with Cheshire Police. These are to be held on a quarterly basis and are proving to be very successful. Please let us know if you have any issues which you feel should be brought to their attention..

May I remind you that all meetings are open to the public and the council looks forward to seeing you.
