## Garden Corner

The next months will be very busy for anyone growing their own vegetables. Gather all fruit and vegetable crops as they ripen. Any surplus put into deep freeze for winter use.

Fruit and vegetables(will need blanching first) can be placed on trays and frozen individually, then packed into bags or containers.

Keep dead heading all flowers and feed tubs and baskets once a week.

Take cuttings of any boarder plants like penstemon and lavender,  
take cuttings from the plant where there are no flowers.

Sow Sweet William and Wall flowers seed ready for planting out in Autumn. Order winter flowering pansys and polyathus (primulas) ready for putting into your tubs and baskets when your summer flowers are spent.

If you are trying to be organic in your approach to gardening, keep feeding the birds, from your winter feeders. Never put whole nuts out. The birds will also than feed off other plants nearby keeping down your aphids.

### Tip of the month
